

## Toolkits

- If you were to create a toolkit to help other organizations adopt and diffuse the medication optimization technology(s) being used in your project, what would you include in the toolkit? (Assume that these “other organizations” would not implement the technology as a research project. Assume they would adopt and diffuse the technology as part of usual care.) The following items would need to be included in a toolkit to help other organizations set up such a program.
  - Basic information regarding the use and trouble-shooting of the PMD machine
  - Information on who could benefit from the PMD machine
  - Reimbursement information
    - Private Pay
    - How to locate grants
    - Specific insurance that may cover the PMD – ie Medi-Caid Waiver programs
    - How to locate local funding opportunities
  - Marketing the program
  - Options for operation of their program
    - If they wish to manage all aspects of the program themselves
    - If they wish to have minimal involvement and will have Philips manage the program
    - If they wish to contract with another agency to manage their program
  - Contracting with Philips
  - Possible impediments that could be predictable.
